THE BURROW

40 Chubb St, Latham, ACT



Nestled in the suburb of Latham, The Burrow is an inspiring, professionally designed garden which includes ponds and a creek, outdoor rooms, and extensive play opportunities for children. The garden comes alive in spring with a wisteria arbour, flowering crab apple and fruit trees as well as bulbs, annuals and edibles. Talks by owners twice daily - check our website for details.



4-5 October

LOUISE AND IAN'S GARDEN

35 Wongoola Close, O'Connor, ACT



A diverse garden situated on three levels; the 1961 house sits between the top and middle sections. The garden features a mix of established trees and shrubs with colour-themed floral areas in the renovated middle section. There is an orchard and productive garden on the lower level. There will be a special visit by Vesna, the Guide Dog ambassador.



COCKLE STREET GARDEN

46 Cockle St, O'Connor, ACT



A mature, lawn-free garden surrounding a mid-century modernist house and featuring mainly native plants which encourage native birds. In the back yard there is a thriving citrus collection along with potted herbs, veggie beds and fruit trees. On the north side of the house is another native plant area featuring sculptures and a large deck.

The Traveller's Garden and Jinka Falls will open together for a single entrance fee. Tickets are available at either garden.

THE TRAVELLER'S GARDEN

23 Camfield Place, Florey, ACT



A compact garden with an exuberant blend of exotic and native plants reflecting both cool climate Canberra and the owner's native Brazil. The outdoor spaces provide inviting areas for relaxation, while water features and striking sculptures add visual interest. Layered planting ensures that the garden remains green throughout the year.

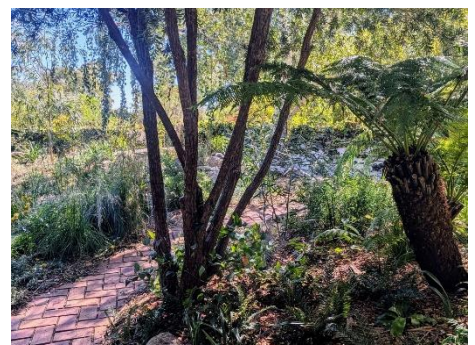


JINKA FALLS

16 Jinka St, Hawker, ACT



A newly established garden, demonstrating what can be achieved with thoughtful design in a small space. It features two garden courtyards: the first is a biodiversity hotspot with ponds connected by a small brook, surrounded by soft native meadow planting; the second is a productive kitchen garden growing vegetables, berries, flowers and fruit.



25-26 October

G AND J'S GARDEN

2 Raoul Place, Lyons, ACT



Set on a large sloping block with spectacular views, this garden has been developing over the past 25 years. Initially designed as a formal garden with stone terraces and hedges, it now also homes a variety of native plants in the mix. Previously opened in autumn 2022 this popular garden will now re-open to showcase spring flowering plants and a newly developed productive garden.



1-2 November

HIDDEN LAKE

95 Morrison Road, Bywong, NSW



The outstanding feature on this 40-acre property is the spectacular lake surrounded by trees and shrubs where a meandering path provides lovely vistas of the lake, house and farm. The house garden consists of native and exotic plants with some sculptural elements, a large deck and several water features. An abundant vegetable garden and orchard are situated close to the house.



TANGLEWOOD

109 McDonnell Drive, Bungendore, NSW



A two-acre rural property situated on the picturesque Buckingham Estate, Tanglewood has been developed from a bare grazing paddock through dense planting of deciduous and native trees, shrubs and groundcovers. The permaculture garden includes an enclosed orchard, an abundant kitchen garden and a pleasantly shaded woodland walk.



8-9 November

THE HEALING GARDEN

20 Badimara Street, Waramanga, ACT



A vibrant sanctuary on a sloping block, The Healing Garden was created just four years ago. Overflowing with hundreds of locally sourced native plants, it's a space of resilience and regeneration. Designed with water-wise principles it features dry riverbeds, frog ponds, native habitats, worm farms and 3D printed bird boxes.



22-23 November

THE NATURALISTIC GARDEN

33 Hackett Gardens, Turner, ACT



The recently redesigned garden has been planted with an eclectic mix of herbaceous perennials that come to life in spring. The large boundary hedge, productive olives and figs, together with low rock walls, pergola and a pond also provide a Mediterranean feel to the garden where the plants intermingle freely.



Garden entry: Gardens are open between 10:00am and 4:00pm, unless otherwise mentioned. Garden entry is free to members. Visitor entry (non-members): Garden entry is \$10 for visitors 18 years and over, cash or Eftpos. Accompanied minors free. No bookings required.
